"When I won the scholarship, it was such a relief, such a huge burden off my shoulders. I was able to fully concentrate on my schoolwork, made the President's List, and was elected president of the Student Government Association," she said. "The work that they do really does change lives. None of the blessings that have come my way would have happened if it wasn't for their initial help."
